One way system

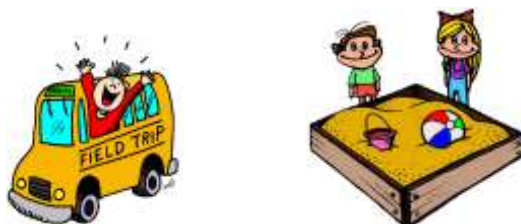
Thank you very much to all families for following our one way system. We would emphasise again that this is for the safety of our children.

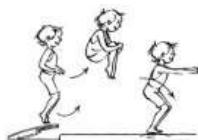
PRIMARY 1

Children in Primary 1 have been busy this February. P1A and P1B are having lots of fun as they continue their drumming sessions, learning new beats along the way.

The children are thriving in their set phonics groups and I am sure they are eager to show you the progress they have made, using their magnetic boards at home.

In Numeracy, the children have begun grouping collections of items. They have been sorting by colours, size and category.

We have started our block of gymnastics sessions with a professional trainer and we look forward to learning more skills as we head towards our Easter holidays.



FIRST LEVEL (P2, P3 AND P4)

PRIMARY 2

Primary 2 pupils have been busy this term continuing with their Scotland and Africa topic. We are looking forward to our trip to Five Sisters Zoo to learn more about African and Scottish animals and their habitats. In Numeracy, we have been finding fractions of shapes and numbers and learning how to tell the time. For Literacy, we have started our Novel Study, "The Twits", and have been learning Scottish words by reading the Scottish version, The Eejits. We have been learning about prediction, have predicted what we think will happen and can't wait to find out what does! In PE, we have been increasing our fitness and stamina and learning about how to keep our bodies healthy by taking part in regular physical activity.



PRIMARY 3

Primary 3 pupils has been practising the 2 and 3 times tables through various activities and consolidating our knowledge of subtraction. Students have also been learning to give change, using subtraction and with the help of 100 number squares. In Literacy, they have learned to identify key features of a news report and finished writing their first news reports on the completion of an Egyptian pyramid.



PRIMARY 4

In Literacy we have been reading and writing a range of poetry. We created our own Valentine's poems focussing on someone special using our emotions and senses. Primary 4A performed a Valentine's assembly to the school telling the story of St Valentine and showcasing their class work.

We have been continuing with our Health topic and have been concentrating on health and hygiene. In the next few weeks we will be examining sleep cycles and how this impacts on our wellbeing.

In ICT we have designed and shared our own PowerPoints on China. We assessed each others' Listening and Talking skills and gave constructive feedback.



SECOND LEVEL (P5, P6 AND P7)

PRIMARY 5

A very busy time is coming up in Primary 5, getting ready for our "Alice – The Musical" performance. We are all designing and building scenery while learning lines and new songs. At the same time we have been trying to complete our Local History study topic, learning all about shopping and how this has changed in the Lasswade and Bonnyrigg area. Skiing will be taking place on a Wednesday with the first session now being Wednesday 14th March, so please ensure all children have suitable clothing on that day.



PRIMARY 6

Primary 6 pupils are well rested after their February break and are looking forward to the remainder of Term 3. This Term we will be moving on from learning about the Scottish Wars of Independence to Space. If you have any exciting artefacts or photos at home to share please send them in with your child. Our Primary 5/6 show is fast approaching and all children are working hard to make this a success. Please encourage your children to practise their lines and songs at home if there is an opportunity. We will also be starting our Healthy Living (Sex Education) topic and we hope that you encourage your children to talk to you at home about what they are learning. Primary 6 were lucky to be able to attend a Chinese New Year show at Lasswade High School where they learnt more about Chinese culture and Mandarin.



PRIMARY 7

Primary 7 took part in an Anderson Shelter challenge, where they had to work as a team to plan, resource and build an Anderson Shelter which could withstand a 1/2 kg weight, was waterproof and wind (hairdryer) proof. The children worked exceptionally hard on these and after testing their shelter completed a reflection task to see if they would modify their designs in the future. Most of the shelters were a huge success, with just a few letting in water.

We have been working on newspaper articles in our writing, learning about all the features that make up a newspaper article and then writing an interesting piece for the reader.

In P.E we have been working on hockey skills and will soon be moving on to learning about rhythm and timing in badminton. We also have an additional block of rugby on a Tuesday, running for 4 weeks.
